VISION:

Every family living in the diverse Historic Northeast Kansas City community will have opportunities to improve their quality of life.

The Northeast Community Center has been an anchor in Kansas City's Historic Northeast neighborhood for nearly 80 years. Founded as an extension of the Italian Mission by Reverend John Bisceglia and his wife Isabella, the center offered support to mostly immigrant families through childcare, educational programs and medical assistance. Throughout the years, The Honorable Charles Shangler, son-in-law of Bisceglia, continued the supportive programs for the changing families in a variety of ways. For 16 years he led a successful charter school on site, Scuola Vita Nuova. In 2015 NECC partnered with KC Housing Authority and United Way of KC to provide complete family educational and social services in our former.

The academic achievement gap between economically disadvantaged children and their more-affluent peers continues to widen.

According to research, **Harmony Project KC** (HPKC) helps bridge that gap.

We commit to our students for their entire childhood (K-12), provided they maintain good attendance in the program and remain enrolled in school.

We provide an intense, year-round orchestral music program combined with character development - helping at-risk youth succeed.

- Free instruments and lessons
- Variety of ensembles (strings, woodwinds, and choir)
- Mentorship program
- College preparation and scholarship support
- Opportunity for parental involvement to build a strong sense of community
- Workshops with internationally accomplished artists.



Since the launch of our program in Kansas City in January 2015, our students have performed at the Kauffman Stadium for the Kansas City Royals, played side-by-side with musicians of the Kansas City Symphony through the Link-Up! Program, at Helzberg Hall through Future Stages at the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts. Locally they have played at the KC Museum, the GEM Theater and many more venues!

As a research-based program, we are constantly tracking our effort to outcomes through report cards, parents and teacher assessments, bi-annual juries that measure our students' musical skill level, and our attendance records.

To build healthier communities by investing in the positive development of children through music.

To develop children as musical ambassadors of peace, hope, and understanding amongst people of diverse cultures, background, and beliefs.

THE RESEARCH

According to the published study by neurobiologist Nina Kraus, PH.D at Northwestern University on Harmony students, music learning shapes the development of the brain and nervous system in a way that improves students' language learning and acquisition, and also improves a student's ability to listen and to hear through noise.

A 10-year study at Brown University determined that artsbased programs more than sports or community service programs produced the most powerful and enduring prosocial impact on young people. The effect was particularly striking for students in underserved communities.

HPKC LONG-TERM GOALS

Develop accountability, responsibility and teamwork through daily practicing, rehearsing, mentoring and performing of music within small ensembles and large orchestras

Develop confidence and courage by performing music publicly in regular scheduled performances

Retrain developing brains through music education to improve the skills of language, math, effective listening, patience, persistence, and focus.

Foster social inclusion by uniting students across barriers of class, culture, and ethnicity

Reduce exposure to negative influences by engaging youth during afterschool hours when they are at greatest risk of abuse, criminal activity, and drug and alcohol use.

Encourage and foster school success and college readiness.

WHAT WE DO IN KANSAS CITY


Up to 5 hours per week of music education year-round
